

Two more Evans Scholarship recipients awarded from Cohoat and O'Neal Caddie Program

Carmel, IN (February 21, 2019) -- After a final selection interview at Sycamore Hills Golf Club in Ft. Wayne, Ind., two Indianapolis-area students from the Cohoat and O'Neal Caddie Program have been awarded the Evans Scholarship. This scholarship provides full college housing and tuition to students who are caddies and is renewable for up to four years at either Indiana University in Bloomington, Ind., or Purdue University in West Lafayette, Ind. The Evans Scholarship is valued at an estimated \$120,000 over four years. Overall, there were 14 students from across Indiana who were awarded scholarships at the January 31st final selection meeting.

Jacob Espey and Nicole Neuenschwader have participated in the Cohoat and O'Neal Caddie Program since 2014. Their character and work ethic made them outstanding applicants and now recipients for the Evans Scholarship. Both caddies attend Westfield High School. Jacob plans to attend Purdue, while Nicole will attend Indiana.

Started in 2014, the Cohoat and O'Neal Caddie Program has a total of 10 students who have become recipients of the Evans Scholarship:

The Evans Scholarship, founded and administered by the Chicago-based Western Golf Association in 1930, is available to both young men and women who have worked as caddies, have excellent academic records, possess outstanding character, and have demonstrated the financial need to fund a college education. The Evans Scholarship has 16 house chapters in leading universities across the country and was recently featured on the television program *Inside Indiana Business with Gerry Dick* (click [here](#) to watch the clip).

It's estimated that after the final selections are completed in April, over 280 new scholarships will be awarded nationwide. Scholarship funds come mainly from contributions by 32,000 golfers across the country who are members of the Evans Scholars Par Club program. Evans Scholars Alumni donate more than \$10 million annually, and all proceeds from the BMW Championship, the third of four PGA TOUR Playoff events in the PGA TOUR's FedExCup competition, are donated to the Evans Scholars Foundation.
